On July 9, 2019, W. Jean Sparks passed away peacefully at age 76 after a brief illness. Born March 1, 1944 as the second child in Young (Saskatchewan), her older sister Vivian quickly became her No. 1 protector and caregiver. Jean remained close to all her siblings and considered her friendship with them as something very special.

But even by the standards of the era, Jean was an exceptional wife and mother. She cared deeply for her family and friends. She didn't do this out of obligation but because of who she really was. Jean was always there first, ready to help. She was an enthusiastic sewist and kindly gave of her time and talent to sew for others. She also regularly brought food and cakes to the homes of many friends, as she was an avid cook and baker! She always ensured that every child who crossed her threshold was safe, healthy and happy. Many considered Jean their second mother.

Jean is survived by her husband Robert, daughters Michelle and Lara, her grandson Corbin and all her cherished siblings.

On the last week of her life, her humor and positivity remained intact, as her faith remained confident that Jehovah will loyally remember her in the resurrection and unite her soon in the coming Paradise with family and friends.
