



## Mrs. Beverleigh Frances Walker

Beverleigh Frances Walker, née Foster, died March 7, 2013, in Oakville, Ontario. She was comforted until her last breath by her loving son, Shaun, and her long-term care-companion, Kareen.

Born in Trenton, Ontario, after WW1, Beverleigh was a quiet, shy girl who wrote stories and poems. As a young adult, her ambition was to be a great writer or radio announcer. This took her to Toronto, but her studies proved more technical than she preferred, so she became an office worker where she met her future husband, Roy Walker.

Beverleigh's legacy was her wholesome dedication to the service of others. Whether it was distributing books to shut-in seniors, serving in various capacities at Willowdale United Church, or defying injustices by singing and writing for the Raging Grannies, Beverleigh selflessly donated her time for the greater good.

In addition to her community service, Beverleigh was a homemaker who raised 3 children: Willow, Douglas, and Shaun. Widowed in 1998 after 44 years of marriage to Roy, she eventually left Toronto, finally settling in a long-term care facility in Halton where she died.

Beverleigh's remains will be cremated and her life will be celebrated privately.
