



## Daisy Gabriella Lazarovits

October 26, 2022

Daisy Lazarovits, nee Bartok, born 1927, in Budapest Hungary, passed away peacefully in her home on her own terms, on October 26 2022.

Daisy is lovingly remembered as a “force of nature”. Due to the atrocities of World War II, she was left the sole survivor of her family, at the age of 15; lived through the Russian invasion of Hungary; married, and with her husband, Paul Farkas and their 6-week-old baby, escaped to Canada in 1948. The family worked in their restaurant, built it into a catering and vending concern, with Daisy then going back to university at age 40, to become a teacher. She remarried in 1994 and she and Steven Lazarovits spent the next decades travelling. Daisy was an avid hiker, member of the Bruce Trail Association, played tennis, was curious about the world, voraciously read the Atlantic Monthly, the Economist and everything else, taking courses at York and Ryerson right until her 95th birthday, always retaining her strong opinions, acerbic wit and sense of humor to the very end.

She is survived by her beloved family: daughters, Suzanne (Toronto, ON) and Marianne (Lexington MA.) and her granddaughter, Kathryn Farkas; as well as her step grandsons, Jamie and Adrian Lazarovits, and their sister, Choe. In Hungary, she is survived by her niece, Erzsébet Korona, her daughter, Zsofi Szabo and her great nephew Istvan; Daisy’s nephew, Zoltan Korona and his two daughters, Sylvie and Judit and their children.

In lieu of flowers, donations can be made in her name to Bruce Trail Conservancy. A celebration of life will be arranged, with details to be announced.

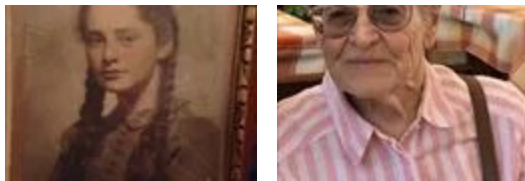
“ Remembering Daisy
