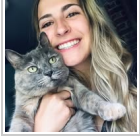

Her works have been selected for exhibitions at John A. Libby Fine Art, Toronto Watercolour Society, The Arts and Letters Club, Mississauga Art Gallery, Rodman Hall Art Gallery, The Niagara Falls Botanical Exhibition and other locations across Ontario.

Dawn won the APUS scholastic Award (U of T), IODE Art Scholarship (Doon School of Fine Arts) and the Richmond Hill Group of Artist Jurors' Choice Art Award.
