“*Dyane was not just a facilitator, an Employment Specialist, a counsellor, and a member of The Career Foundation’s Lawrence Square team; she was a devoted mother and a loving soul. I remember a few years ago she came to the office with a big travel suitcase in the morning. I asked her where she was going. She said, “I am going to Ottawa to help my daughter sort out a problematic rental room issue. I wanted to catch the train after work.” She always had her daughter on her mind. I also remember she had a picture of her beautiful daughter on the desk – it was the only decoration that she had on her workstation.*

Dyane was a person who loved colours and used them so very creatively at work. If you looked at her client files, you would find colourful sticky notes with reminders on them; if you went through her list of clients, you would see colours on the spreadsheet that represented the stages of the job search process that the clients were in; if you ever saw the wall behind her chair, you would be amazed by the colours of nature in the pictures that she put up. She made her office a very welcoming and friendly space for anyone to share the life stories.

Dyane was the Health & Safety warrior and guardian for our team for more than six years. She was always on top of updating the Health and Safety binder in the office, reminding the team of any safety hazard in time, completing the monthly safety inspection checklist, and organizing the Health & Safety orientations for new employees, students and volunteers. She was so meticulous and careful with all the details. We never had a non-compliance issue or injury when she was around.

Dyane was also known as the handy-woman on the team. In fact, she was the only person in the office that had a set of tools in a professional tool box. I remember she put tethers on the book cases in our Resource and Information area to prevent them from falling; she put holders on the wall for our emergency flashlights; she fastened the rack for the fire extinguisher in the staff kitchen; she

changed the lock for my office so proficiently as if she was a locksmith.

Dyane had manifold talents. She was the artist and professional poster maker in our office. I couldn't remember how many large-sized posters (18" x 24" or 24" x 36") she designed and created for our career events over the years. But we are still using the signs that she created for our computer area and the "Scents Sensitivity" sign at the reception. So yes, we will always remember you and miss you, Dyane.

Dyane made many great contributions to The Career Foundation's Lawrence Square team and helped it move forward in numerous ways. Her work here will not soon be forgotten. My deepest sympathies are with Dyane's family at this time. Please know that you are in our thoughts as you grieve this loss.
