Doug “Dougie” Pennie passed away peacefully on Oct 15th, 2017 in Toronto aged 85 years. Douglas Pennie was born September 14th 1932 in Dundee Scotland. He moved with his family to Birmingham England before the start of WWII. He served in the RAF LAC (Leading aircraftman) 1953-1955. Doug followed in his father’s footsteps and apprenticed as a press tool & dye maker at Fisher and Ludlow, and then went on to work at Canadian Car & Bombardier.
