Gord played a solid game of tennis but enjoyed a fast Masters level badminton match even more and developed lifelong friends on those courts. At home, he found time to coach several local soccer teams and the family front lawn was where the neighbourhood kids met if they wanted to play soccer, kick the can, badminton or maybe a game of 'cut-off' on bicycles.
