

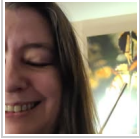


Ms. Irmgard Katie Wieler

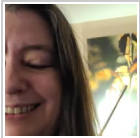

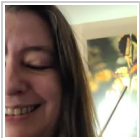

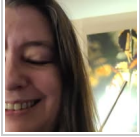
