A memorable incident involved a large black rabbit that would defecate on my pillow and chew my stereo wires. I recall Keiron's distress when I placed the rabbit in the oven, albeit with the oven off, as a warning that I was irritated. I later met a girl moved to Toronto, but not to worry K wasn't far behind. He soon asked if I remembered a girl called Paula from Guelph, whom I didn't recall, but Keiron was smitten.
