hoy despidiéndole a nuestra Madre, excepto Miguel+ que se adelantó hace poco para recibir a su Madre y su tía Sarita en el cielo.

Madre amorosa y sacrificada con sus hijos, supo inculcarnos sempiternos valores de honestidad y pulcritud, sobre todo el amor y respeto a Dios y nuestros semejantes.
