We made a point of seeing her long after she retired from cleaning. I was struck by her huge love for animals, her strong sense of justice and the need to cheer for the underdog and to protect the weak, and her wonderful laugh and sense of humour. Marina loved her coffee. My wife Dawna used to make her a latte and she would exclaim how good it tasted - "like an angel peed on my tongue!" We would laugh so hard. I learned about her long service at the Humane Society and how quitting during the strike cost her a big financial settlement. I know retirement was hard financially and was so thrilled for her when a Dutch pension arrived that made everything manageable. I am sorry I did not write earlier but we have lost too many people in recent years and it is difficult to process that suddenly they are gone. I did not get to see Marina a last time but we exchanged several messages and she told me she was at peace with her life and did not want to suffer through chemo. RIP Marina, I hope you are surrounded by your beloved animals and we will always love you. Dave

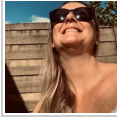
