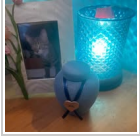

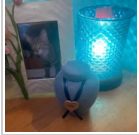

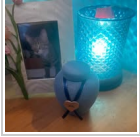

My condolences to her family.

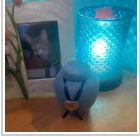
