He has left a void here, and it is hard to believe that he is really gone. All of us still expect to see him sitting in the living room, making his beloved cards.

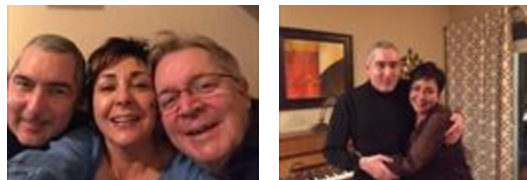
I feel so grateful that he allowed me to be a part of his journey, and I will never forget him.
