On January 16, 2023, Peter Bing Doon Lee, beloved uncle and friend, passed away peacefully at age 98.

Peter was born in Montreal, Quebec, on July 7, 1924, the youngest of seven sons. His horizons were broadened at a young age: When 11 years old, he, one of his brothers, and mother moved to China, where Peter lived for the next 14 years. There, he studied agronomy at Sun Yat-sen University, and worked as a technician at the Royal Observatory in Hong Kong.

Post-war, Peter accompanied his mother back to Montreal. He studied radio and television electronics at DeVry Institute in Chicago before his many years as a technician at CBC television in Toronto, Ontario.

Peter's experiences focused his lifelong respect for others. His manner was unfailingly kind, and he always put the needs of others first. Respect for all religions was important to him.

Playing bridge was Peter's favourite hobby, and his delight was contagious when a bridge table was set up for a rubber or two, or more.

During his latter years, Peter moved to Lakeshore Lodge, then the Re kai Centre – Wellesley Central Place in Toronto, for full time care. He handled his later physical challenges quietly, with strength and with stoicism.

Peter lived his life with honour, caring, and decency. He leaves behind a lasting legacy of memories and devotion to his family and friends. He is very much loved, and will always be remembered.

Peter is predeceased by his parents; brothers Edward, Henry, Jimmy, Frank, Tom, and Andrew; and nephew David. He is survived by his loving sister-in-law Mary; nieces and nephews Freda and Douglas; Sherry and Perry; Carol and Ron; Don and Barb; grand-nephews Mike and Chris; great-grand-nephews and nieces Matthew, Isabella, Aaleyah, Charles, and Adelaide; and his close Family of friends.

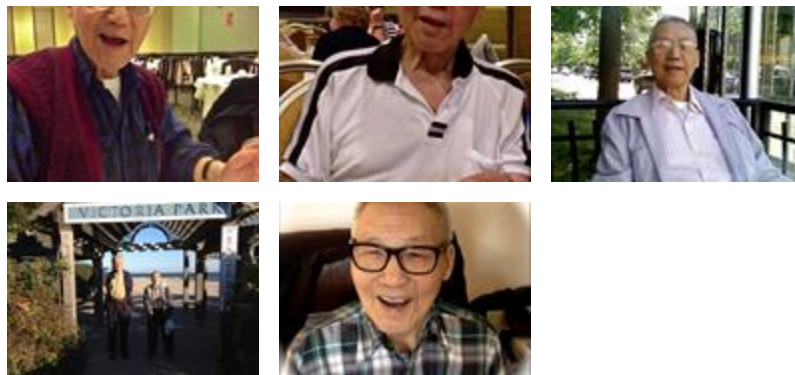

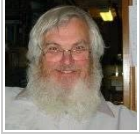
