



Mrs. Zsuzsanna Kettlewell

Zsuzsanna (Zsuzsi) Kettlewell passed away peacefully in Toronto on Monday, September 12th, 2016.

Zsuzsi was born in Budapest, Hungary, on April 14th, 1945 and grew up under the oppressive Soviet regime. She attended school in Budapest, and, after graduating from high school, she studied pharmacy. In 1970, she escaped from Hungary and entered Canada as a refugee to join other relatives who had emigrated before the War. She met (Harold) Don Kettlewell in Toronto, and fell in love and married him. Together they had a son, Brian. Zsuzsi worked as a pharmaceutical technician at Sunnybrook Hospital. Zsuzsi retired and with Don moved to the Kitchener to be closer to Brian while he studied at Waterloo. Subsequently, Zsuzsi and Don returned to Toronto to a small apartment on Carlton Street to be closer to her mother, Maria, in her final years. In their last year, Zsuzsi and Don resided and were cared for at Copernicus Lodge where they visited each other from different rooms as often as they could.

Zsuzsi is survived by her brother, Csaba (Panni) Páska in Hungary, her son, Brian Kettlewell (Jee Young Kim), Don's children Leah Nelson (Ward), Pete Kettlewell (Eileen), Nona Kettlewell (Inge Wennegren), and Marcy Kettlewell, Don's loving grandchildren Justin Nelson (Heather), Spencer Kettlewell, and Damen Masson, and Don's great grandchildren Hannah and Jack.

A celebration of Zsuzsi's life will be held at the small chapel at Copernicus Lodge (66 Roncesvalles Ave.) in Toronto on Saturday, September 24th from

3:30 to 7:00 pm, and, at a later date, her ashes will be brought to Hungary, where a funeral will be held at the Farkasréti Cemetery in Budapest, where she can peacefully remain with her mother and other beloved family members.
